- If you are late to lessons please don't forget to apologise for being late




Attendance part 2 reminders

When things go wrong restorative conversations and practice

What is Restorative Practice?

It's like shifting the focus from "Who messed up?" to "What happened, and how can we move forward together?"

- It's about talking it out: Instead of blaming someone, restorative practice brings everyone involved in a problem together to talk openly about what happened and how everyone's been affected.
- Repairing harm, not punishing: Restorative practice looks at ways to move forward, like getting more support or apologising for the impact on those who have been hurt, and thinking about what should happen next.
- Building stronger connections: By understanding each other better and working through problems, restorative practice helps strengthen relationships between students, teachers, and the whole college community.






Exams: be ready for any exams
